Telehandler Training Courses Red Deer - The employer has the responsibility to make certain that their workers are trained to work competently using telehandler machines. The employees must be assessed for their ability to make use of the equipment. If deficiencies are found, employers need to provide training so that workers get the needed level of ability. The responsibility level of the person should be taken into account when training is offered. Effective training would remedy whatever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training can be undertaken by hiring an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment at the completion of the training period will determine if the learning goals have been met or not.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not deal with such subject matters as the lifting of persons, the lifting of suspended loads, the use of various attachments, or the use of rotating machinery. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work location.

Inspection and maintenance

The telehandler requires routine maintenance like any other machinery. The machine would wear out eventually, so proper maintenance is required to ensure the safe use of the telehandler equipment. Inspections and checks are vital to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators should have machine-specific training in order to rectify, monitor and prevent problems connected with damage, wear and deterioration. Employees need competence and experience in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance directions of the manufacturer must be seriously viewed and complied with, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The responsibility for making sure that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the user and owner of the equipment. Pre-use inspections are usually performed by the user, whereas general maintenance is usually performed by the telehandler owner.
